

### ENHANCED CONTROL, WITH PENCIL PRECISION

Easier to control than watercolour paint pans, Derwent Watercolour Pencils are ideal for more accurate drawing and less mess. They can be sharpened to a point for detailed work.

Once combined with water, interesting colour flows can be created. Apply water to the pigment on the paper surface, to the page first, or even the pencil tip for a range of watercolour techniques.

### **USEWET OR DRY**

Derwent Watercolour Pencils have a soft texture and can be used dry as well as combined with water; allowing artists to draw and paint with complete control. They are easy to blend and build up in light layers.

Watercolour is not permanent like Derwent Inktense, so once the colour is dry you can re-wet it and move it about again.

Combine with other water-soluble pencils, such as Derwent Water-soluble Sketching, Derwent Graphitint or Derwent Inktense for mixed media work.





#### SUBTLE COLOUR PALETTE

Derwent Watercolour Pencils are subtler in colour than the Derwent Inktense range.

They are what artists expect from a traditional watercolour medium in terms of palette, laydown and solubility. Ideal for creating landscapes, seascapes, en plain air and traditional artworks.
